- ❖ To ask geographical questions about the UK and a contrasting non European country.



Key Vocabulary:

Continent- A large solid land mass.

Beach- A pebbly or sandy shore.

Cliff- A steep rock face.

Coast- The part of the land adjoining or near the sea

Forest- A large area covered with trees.

Hill- A naturally raised area of land.

Mountain- A natural rise in the land that is above everything else.

Sea- A large area of salt water.

Ocean- Large area of salt water.

River- large natural stream of water flowing in a channel to the sea, a lake, or another river.

Explorer- A person who explores a new or unfamiliar area.

Navigator – A person who navigates a ship or aircraft.

Pilot- The person who flies the plane.

Landslide- When a mountain or cliff collapses.

Knowledge:

- ❖ Use an atlas to locate the continents , oceans and countries around the world.
- ❖ Physical and human features around the world.
- ❖ Physical features- beach, cliff, coast, forest, hill, mountain, sea, ocean, river, soil, valley, vegetation, seasons and weather.
- ❖ Human features- city, town, village, factory, farm, house, office, port, harbour and shop.
- ❖ The similarities and differences between Bridlington Beach and Bondi Beach in Australia.
- ❖ Bondi Beach is one of Australia's most famous beaches.
- ❖ Bridlington is a seaside resort in an area which is said to have the highest coastal erosion rate in Europe.
- ❖ Captain James Cook was a great explorer and navigator. He is believed to have created the first accurate map of the Pacific Ocean.
- ❖ Amy Johnson was a female pilot from Britain. She was the first ever woman to fly to Australia alone.
- ❖ The Holbeck Hall Hotel in Scarborough fell in to the sea after a landslide in 1993.
